

MINUTES OF THE 49TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA (SOUTHERN BRANCH) ON 26TH MARCH 2022 VIA ZOOM APPLICATION.

1.0 Opening Address by the Chairman for Session 2021/2022

- 1.1 The Chairman, Ir. Wong Yee Foong (M18146) called the meeting in order at 9.30 a.m. and extended his gratitude to all members who were present in the meeting. This year's Annual General Meeting (AGM) was conducted by Virtual Platform.
- 1.2 The Chairman welcomed President IEM, Vice President IEM, Past Chairmen IEM Southern Branch and Executive Committee members.
- 1.3 The Chairman informed that during Session 2021/2022 most of the activities were conducted via Virtual Platform. IEM (Southern Branch) was given the opportunity to host the AFEO Governing Board Meeting at Johor Bahru (2021). However, IEM (Southern Branch) proposed that IEM HQ to host AFEO Governing Board Meeting via Virtual Platform due to the COVID-19 as the delegates were unable to travel.
- 1.4 The Chairman informed that this year 2022, the 21st AFEO Governing Board Meeting will be hosted by IEM (Southern Branch) (IEMSB) in Johor Bahru with the blessing and support from IEM HQ and this will be the first time for IEMSB to organise an important task.
- 1.5 The Chairman informed that the IEM Guideline on the Prevention and Control of Dengue has completed and he would like to thank the Special Committee led by IEM Past Chairman and Past President Y. Bhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock, Ir. John Cheah, Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hayati Abdullah, Ir. S. Thayala, Dato' Ir. Mohd Noh Ibrahim and representatives from IEM Branches.

2.0 Confirmation of Minutes of the 48th Annual General Meeting

- 2.1 Minutes of the 48th Annual General Meeting IEM (Southern Branch) was confirmed as proposed by Ir. Lim Soon Keng (M07528) and seconded by Ir. Puen Tak Hong (F05558).

3.0 Matters Arising

- 3.1 The Chairman further discussed the following items in the Minutes of the 48th Annual General Meeting
 - 3.1.1 The Chairman congratulated Special Task Force on IEM Guideline on the Prevention and Control of Dengue and it has been accepted by IEM HQ Council for the publication for public use.
 - 3.1.2 The Chairman clarified for Item 4.3 that raised by Ir. Prof. Dr. Abdul Aziz Abdul Samad (M18426) regarding the number of memberships for IEM Student Members in Southern Branch. Student

members from UTM joined voluntarily and from UTHM is compulsory. However, for UiTM, IEM has received no Student Members registration due to the campus in Pasir Gudang being among Diploma students. Also, Chairman informed that the Sub-Committee Chairman will look into the matter and encourage UiTM students to join IEM.

- 3.1.3 The Chairman clarified for Item 10.2 raised by Ir. Prof. Dr. Abdul Aziz Abdul Samad (M18426) regarding the transfer grade of existing IEM Member to Engineering Technologist Grade and has been clarified by IEM President during IEM (Southern Branch) 48th Annual General Meeting. Chairman informed that previously there was a webinar on the new Engineering Technician and Technologist Membership conducted by IEM Headquarter and encouraged Members to join the webinar and have more elaboration on the new membership grades.
- 3.1.4 The Chairman clarified for Item 10.3 raised by Ir. Lim Soon Keng (M07528) that the issue has been addressed also by IEM President during the last 48th AGM, where the proposals of the relevant guidelines are awaiting approval and soon will be released for the good use of IEM members and public industries.
- 3.1.5 The Chairman clarified for Item 10.4 raised by Ir. Lim Soon Keng (M07528) regarding the situation of IEM (Southern Branch)'s financial. Due to the continuous COVID-19 lock down and the loss of rental income, all suggestions and proposals to generate income for IEMSB will be looked into by the new Executive Committee.
- 3.1.6 The Chairman clarified on Item 10.7 raised by Ir. Prof. Mohamad Afifi Bin Abdul Mukti (M01793) regarding the purchase of new property to generate income. Chairman informed that due to the loss of rental income and not much activities conducted, it has seriously impacted Southern Branch's financial. The suggestion will be look into by the new Executive Committee.
- 3.1.7 The Chairman clarified on Item 10.8 raised by Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463) regarding the visibility of engineers to the society. Chairman informed that IEM (Southern Branch) has successfully done a fundraising for Food Bank in August 2021. The food bank was channelled to other charity organisations. Chairman hoped that this effort is one of the ways for engineers to be visible in the eye of society.

4.0 Annual Report for Session 2021/2022

- 4.1 The Honorary Secretary, Ir. Kamisan Turiman (M21660) presented the summary of the 49th Annual Report. Ir. Kamisan proceeded to present the Branch Activities for Session 2021/2022 as per pages 12 to 28 of the Annual Report.
- 4.2 The Honorary Secretary highlighted the decrease of Overall Grade of Membership (9.35%) which consist of decrease in Corporate Members (6.79%), Graduate Members (25.10%) and Student Members (6.74%) which decrease from the total number of 5,365 in year the 2021 to 4,863 in year the 2022.
- 4.3 Ir. Zainuddin Md Ghazali (F04945) raised his concern about the drastic decrease of all grades of membership which is getting less than the previous year. The Chairman answered that one of the reasons is due to the non-payment of Membership Fee, and another reason is due to the change of address especially for Corporate Members and Graduate Members. IEM (Southern Branch) will follow up with IEM HQ to get further details on this issue.
- 4.4 The meeting accepted the Annual Report as proposed by Ir. Zainuddin Md Ghazali (F04945) and seconded by Ir. Chong Woei Heng (M22025).

5.0 Statement of Financial Accounts Ending 31st December 2021

- 5.1 The Financial Report starting from 1st January 2021 ending 31st December 2021 was presented by the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Nguee Chin Seng (M64850) as per pages 30 to 31 of the Annual Report.
- 5.2 As there were no further clarifications and amendments, the meeting unanimously adopted the Financial Report as proposed by Ir. Chong Woei Heng (M22025) and seconded by Ir. Quek Swee Kim (F05009).

6.0 Election of Internal Auditors

- 6.1 The Chairman thanked the Internal Auditors, Ir. Prof. Mohamad Afifi bin Abdul Mukti (M01793) and Ir. Ling Ngie Soon (F12685) for their contributions and services as Internal Auditors for Session 2021/2022.
- 6.2 Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hayati Abdullah (F16513) proposed that the services of the current auditors Ir. Prof. Mohamad Afifi bin Abdul Mukti (M01793) and Ir. Ling Ngie Soon (F12685) to be maintained as Internal Auditors for Session 2022/2023. This was seconded by Ir. Zainuddin Md Ghazali (F04945). Both candidates were unanimously accepted by members.
- 6.3 Dato' Ir. David Lee Hoke Hai (F11384) proposed that T.J. Wang continues as IEM (Southern Branch) External Auditor which was seconded by Ir. Chong Woei Heng (M22025).

7.0 Election Results for Executive Committee for Session 2022/2023

- 7.1 The election results for the Executive Committee for session 2022/2023 were announced by the Election Officer, Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463). The results are listed as follows:
 - 7.1.1 **Chairman**
In accordance with Clauses 9 & 13 of Branch's Bylaws & Regulations, the Executive Committee meeting held on 22nd December 2021 has unanimously elected Ir. Thayala R. Selvaduray (M03717) as Chairman for Session 2022/2023.
 - 7.1.2 **Vice Chairman**
Ir. Prof. Dr. Sharul Kamal Abdul Rahim (M22001) was elected as Vice Chairman for Session 2022/2023 and 2023/2024.
 - 7.1.3 **Hon. Secretary**
Ir. Kamisan Bin Turiman (M21660) was elected as Honorary Secretary for Session 2022/2023.
 - 7.1.4 **Hon. Treasurer**
Ir. Nguee Chin Seng (M64850) was elected as Honorary Treasurer for Session 2022/2023.
 - 7.1.5 **General Committee Members**
Ir. Bong Beng Siong (M70303) and Ir. Thirumurugan A/L Manikam (M24895) were elected as General Committee Member for 2 Sessions 2022/2023 and 2023/2024.
- 7.2 Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463) thanked the scrutineers, Ir. Teh Sea Chuan (F01714) and Ir. Koh Thong How (M05856), for their assistance rendered during the election process.
- 7.3 The Chairman, Ir. Wong Yee Foong (M18146), on behalf of IEM (Southern Branch) thanked Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463) and the Scrutineers for their assistance in conducting the election process.

8.0 Change of Office Bearers

- 8.1 The Chairman thanked all IEM (Southern Branch) Executive Committee Members for their cooperation and support in Session 2021/2022.
- 8.2 The Chairman welcomed the new line-up of Executive Committee Members for Session 2022/2023.

9.0 Address by the President, Session 2021/2022

- 9.1 The Chairman invited IEM President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon (F11938) to give Presidential Address to the members.
- 9.2 The President congratulated the branch for the successful AGM and the elected IEM (Southern Branch) Executive Committee for Session 2022/2023. President informed the meeting that IEM may still arrange for meeting or activities virtually via Zoom, by 1st April 2022 as we shall transition into endemic period but more activities can now be conducted face-to-face.
- 9.3 President informed that IEM has targeted to have the inaugural ENGINEER in 2020 but due to the pandemic, it was postponed to 2021 and yet, the plans continued to be derailed by the inability to contain the spread of virus. But after two years, IEM has successfully organised ENGINEER 2022, a trade exhibition showcasing engineering solution. Held concurrently with 4 symposiums of IEM Convention namely ASEAN Electrotechnical Symposium (IESE), Water Resources Symposium, ASEAN Engineering Digital Summit (ASEAN EDX) and Project Management Symposium (PROMAC), the exhibition attracted a total of 5,247 visitors.
- 9.4 President informed that the ENGINEER 2022 has grouped together industry leaders to present the future of Engineering, and the might of Science, Technology, and Engineering & Mathematic (STEM) as part of IEM's effort to elevate the profession and industry besides being another source of income for IEM. This venture enables IEM to add a minimum of RM200,000.00 each year to IEM coffers and President would like to express his gratitude for the support from all the Branches and hope that will continue support this event which will be organized on an annual basis.
- 9.5 President informed that within one month of first MCO, IEM has moved its seminars online. From April 2020 to the end of February 2022, the various Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups and Sections have conducted 539 Webinars, offering a total of 1,266.5 CPD hours. These webinars had enabled IEM to maintain its income source which could have been greatly impacted due to the inability to conduct physical training programmes.
- 9.6 President informed that in the years of 2021 and 2022, IEM has signed a series of Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) with different professional bodies and institutions of higher education, for example: The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) Malaysia Chapter, Heriot Watt University of Malaysia, Politeknik Ungku Omar, Bank Islam, Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET) Malaysia Local Network and the latest being the Association of Malaysia Airlines Licensed Aircraft Engineers (AMALAE). President also thanked the groundwork laid by IEM (Southern Branch); IEM has also inked an MoU with Johor Centre for Construction Development (JCCD). The joint activities such as knowledge sharing or technical support will surely further the public interest, ultimately benefitting the wider community.
- 9.7 President informed that another important MoU IEM managed to sign late last year was with Malaysia Association for Local Authorities (MALA). MALA represents 94 out of the total of 155 local councils in Malaysia. The MoU aims to encourage the transfer of knowledge and skills from the professional fraternity to the municipalities across Malaysia to ensure that the public will benefit from more stringent engineering excellence which will translate into a standard living that meets the demand of our highly urbanised populations.

- 9.8 President highlighted that the Southern Branch is also the first IEM Branch to purchase a property of its own way back in 1985 at RM310,000.00. 20% of the purchase price was provided by IEM HQ while the balance was through bank loan. The bank loan had been settled many years ago and the property was able to be the home of IEM (Southern Branch) members all these years.
- 9.9 President informed that in the past due to the IEM's Constitution, Bylaws and policies, all properties purchased need to be registered in the name of IEM. This had been an issue of contention over the years but due to various policies and restrictions, IEM HQ had to maintain the ownership that way to protect all parties and to ensure there would be no risk of losing the property due to technicality. However, since last year IEM HQ had been looking into possible enablers to allow Branches to be given ownership of the property purchased. A Task Force headed by IEM Past President, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Hj. Keizrul Abdullah and assisted by IEM Past President Y. Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik and Y. Bhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock, was formed to look into the matter. President announced that the IEM Council at its last meeting on 21st March 2022 had accepted the recommendation of the Task Force that Branches can be allowed to own properties in their name. IEM will be looking into the accounting transaction, legal documents, etc. to affect the transfer. President hope the Branch members will bear with IEM a little longer to ensure all documentations are properly executed.
- 9.10 President would like to congratulate the Southern Branch members in combating Dengue Fever. The Southern members under the leadership of IEM Past President, Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock and IEM (SB) Past Chairman Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hayati Abdullah had spearheaded the preparation of the IEM Guidelines on Prevention and Control of Dengue. These guidelines have been presented to the IEM Council and is currently awaiting approval. President also would like to thank all IEM (Southern Branch) members who has actively participated in the drafting of these guidelines especially Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong who had relentlessly promoted and assisted in driving the initiatives. President added that this initiative is also the first inter Branch-HQ-Technical Division collaboration, a truly IEM global effort. This will be the third Guideline published by IEM, after the IEM Guidelines on Testing and Commissioning of Fire Protection System and IEM Guideline on Fire Abatement Equipment.

10.0 Any other Business

- 10.1 Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186) was then invited to present his report on the Ad-Hoc Dengue Committee. He thanked all the Task Force Committee Member for their effort in combating the dengue. He informed the meeting that the 4th International Conference on Dengue Control and Prevention – "A Perspective of An Engineer's Approach Through Social Engineering to Fight the Bite" organized by Rotary Club Muar (D3310) will be held at SKT Hall, Muar, Johor on 31st March 2022. IEM (Southern Branch) Chairman will talk about "Engineers Approach through Social Housekeeping and Community to Fight the Bite" and the session will be moderated by IEM Past President, Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock. He then thanked all involved parties in completing the guidelines and for their support. The guidelines will be useful to all engineers and relevant authorities in the fight of dengue.
- 10.2 Chairman thanked all committees for giving him an opportunity to become the Chairman of IEM (Southern Branch) and wishing a smooth execution of the upcoming 21st AFEO Mid-Term Governing Board Meeting in August 2022.
- 10.3 Ir. Mohammad Khir Mohd (F18791) shared briefly regarding ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations (AFEO) and informed that AFEO is celebrating its 40th Anniversary in 2022.

The chairman then expressed his thanks to everyone for the smooth annual general meeting and adjourned the meeting at 12.30 p.m.

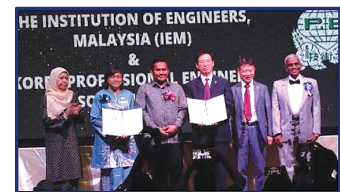
❖ **IEM (Southern Branch) Annual Dinner and Awards Night 2022**



The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Institution's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Committee members.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Committee members' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Institution's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditors' report to the related disclosures in the financial statements of the Institution or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditors' report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Institution to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements of the Institution, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the Committee members regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

In accordance with the requirements of the Societies Act, 1966 in Malaysia, we also report that in our opinion, the accounting and other records and the registers required by the Act to be kept by the Institution have been properly kept in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
