MINUTES OF THE 50TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA (SOUTHERN BRANCH) ON 9TH MARCH 2024 AT GRAND PARAGON HOTEL, JOHOR BAHRU.

1.0 Opening Address by the Chairman for Session 2023/2024

- 1.1 The Chairman, Ir. Thayala R. Selvaduray (M03717) called the meeting to order at 11.00 a.m. He extended his gratitude to all members who were present in the meeting.
- 1.2 He noted that his chairmanship began shortly after a recovery period, requiring adaptation to hybrid meetings and navigating the challenges of a recovering business environment and shifting mindsets. Despite the difficulties and the "ups and downs," he expressed his honour in having served and enjoyed the experience.
- 1.3 The Chairman emphasized IEM Southern Branch's (IEMSB) leadership role and its commitment to collaboration with other professional bodies. Highlighting IEM's history since 1959 and its diverse membership, he encouraged engineers to embrace leadership and take pride in their contributions. He acknowledged the post-COVID shifts, including the prevalence of online meetings and increased social media use, noting the challenges of balancing these changes. He reported that IEMSB's membership had exceeded 5,500 members and IEM Malaysia's had surpassed 50,000, outlining their work in professional development, guidelines, awareness programs, and government collaboration. The Chairman expressed gratitude for the mentorship and support received during his two-year chairmanship, acknowledging the challenges and the rewarding experience of serving members, society and authorities.
- 1.4 The Chairman summarized IEMSB's diverse activities, including seminars, technical talks, visits, young engineers' events, gatherings, university collaborations (UTM and UTHM), and networking with national and ASEAN-region organizations (SIJORI, AFEO, CAFEO). He thanked the committee, secretariats, and YES for their contributions to his successful two-year term, emphasizing teamwork in notable events.
- 1.5 The Chairman's initial challenge was pursuing a vision for an engineering incubation centre, a long-term project driven by the IEM President, Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Norlida Binti Buniyamin (F13746), to promote self-sustainability and property ownership for each branch. The President envisioned that IEMSB to acquire its own land.
- 1.6 The Chairman reported the successful hosting of the AFEO Mid-Term Meeting in August 2022, supported by various organizations and the Johor State Government. Over 150 engineers from ASEAN countries participated in the three-day event, which included meetings with ASEAN women and young engineers. Discussions focused on engineering cooperation and developing guidelines in areas such as emergency preparedness, engineering mobility, transportation, education, sustainable cities, safety, and manufacturing, involving all ten ASEAN nations. These guidelines are discussed at the biannual conferences.



- 1.7 The Chairman highlighted the publication of the "IEM Guideline on the Prevention and Control of Dengue" in April 2022, a nationwide effort initiated by IEM in 2021, with special thanks to Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186), led by Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock (HF02531), IEMSB's past chairman and current IEM President, the task force of 23 engineers, including five from IEMSB, produced the handbook, which has been distributed nationally and internationally, including to Rotary Clubs. It is also being considered for university engineering curriculum. The Chairman praised Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock's leadership and Ir. John Cheah's continued dedication to the project.
- 1.8 The Chairman described DECCO (Developers, Engineers, Consultants, and Contractors), an organization of eight professional bodies, including IEMSB, working with the Greater Johor Bahru local authorities (MBJB, MBMK, MBIP, MBPG) to accelerate development. IEMSB was represented by Dato' Ir. Ng Ah Kow (F04883) and Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hayati Binti Abdullah (F16513) in these meetings, where engineers are highly regarded and given priority. The Chairman emphasized the importance of maintaining this level of engagement with professional bodies.
- 1.9 The Chairman also updated the resumption of fellowship activities with the Institution of Engineers Singapore (IES). Recognizing increased mobility between the two countries, both IEMSB and IES agreed to focus on young engineer fellowships, including university programs and graduate exchanges. The hope is that young engineers will continue to build this relationship.
- 1.10 The Chairman updated the meeting on IEMSB's pilot project for STEM education, recognizing its national importance despite controversies. The project, initially led by Ts. Kenneth Chaw Vui Ken and later by Dr. Yip Bao Fang (G74811), involved a secondary school, SMK Dato' Syed Esa, Batu Pahat, chosen for its accessibility and proximity to UTHM, enabling mobilization of resources. The Chairman emphasized the need for IEM to collaborate with young engineers and schools to develop future engineers. He also noted the importance of IEMSB extending its reach beyond Johor Bahru.
- 1.11 The Chairman highlighted IEMSB's 50th Golden Jubilee Anniversary celebration in 2023, which included the introduction of a new award: the Engineering Excellence Award. Intended for Johorbased companies, the award was presented to Serumpun Konsultant Sdn. Bhd. and Austin Height Sdn. Bhd. The frequency of this prestigious award whether annual, one-off, or periodic is under review by a committee of past chairmen.
- 1.12 The Chairman discussed the revival of the SIJORI (Singapore-Johor-Riau), originally a government initiative. The focus has shifted to engineering collaboration, specifically in education, with the next meeting planned for Singapore in June or July, coinciding with a mid-term AFEO meeting. The goal is to capitalize on the existing AFEO network to facilitate fellowship, business opportunities, and mobility within the region, recognizing the increasing manpower movement between Singapore, Indonesia, and the ASEAN region. The Chairman emphasized the potential benefits for personal development, companies, and fellowship.
- 1.13 The Chairman highlighted the professional development of technologists and technicians as the subsequent challenge, acknowledging their critical role in supporting engineers. He noted BEM's recent inclusion of technologists and technicians as members and IEM's adoption of this practice. He stressed the need to further encourage those qualified as technologists and technicians, and emphasized that young engineers should focus on their own development.

2.0 Confirmation of Minutes of the 50th Annual General Meeting

2.1 Minutes of the 50th Annual General Meeting IEM (Southern Branch) was confirmed as proposed by Ir. Puen Tak Hong (F05558) and seconded by Ir. Abdul Manap Bin Ali Hasan (M03450).



3.0 Matters Arising

- 3.1 The Chairman further discussed the following items in the Minutes of the 50th Annual General Meeting.
 - 3.1.1 Page 9, Item 10.2.2: Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186) advised on the terminology used. He recommended using the term "plogging" to describe the activity of picking up trash while jogging. He noted that this term is officially used by Jawatankuasa Tindakan Wabak Denggi Negeri Johor.

4.0 Annual Report for Session 2023/2024

- 4.1 The Honorary Secretary, Ir. Elaine Liew Shu Fang (M55886) presented the summary of the 51st Annual Report. Ir. Elaine Liew proceeded to present the Branch Activities for Session 2023/2024 as per pages 13 to 27 of the Annual Report.
- 4.2 Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463) raised concerns regarding the trend of decreasing overall membership. He highlighted the substantial increase in Fellow members alongside a decrease in Graduate members. He suggested that IEMSB capitalize on its existing relationships with university students to bolster student membership. The Chairman explained that the increase in Fellow members could be attributed to upgrades from Corporate Member grade, transfers from other states, or individuals who recently passed the professional interview. Ir. Wong Yee Foong (M18146) added that the COVID-19 pandemic likely contributed to the overall membership decline, as some members may have paused their renewals.
- 4.3 Ir. Ooi Kao Yang (F02331) expressed concern regarding the fluctuating number of Fellow members between 2022 and 2024 and requested that IEMSB seek clarification from IEM HQ regarding these figures. The Chairman informed the meeting that the committee would review this issue.
- 4.4 Ir. Dr. Eow John Son (M23840) proposed that the IEMSB committee organize talks for university students and staff at UiTM and UniKL in Johor Bahru to promote membership subscriptions, expanding outreach beyond UTM, UTHM, and SUC. Ir. David Puen Ming Shen (M43622) clarified that UiTM currently focuses on diploma engineering students and that an IEMSB sub-committee member is affiliated with UiTM. He further noted that UiTM Pasir Gudang's application to form a Student Section is pending, while UniKL's is currently in order. The Chairman added that SUC has a signed MoU with IEM and has successfully established a Student Section.
- 4.5 The meeting accepted the Annual Report as proposed by Ir. Lee Meng Chiat (F11358) and seconded by Dato' Ir. Steve Chong Yoon On (F03974).

5.0 Statement of Financial Accounts Ending 31st December 2023

- 5.1 The Financial Report starting from 1st January 2023 ending 31st December 2023 was presented by the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Juraimi Bin Masood (M53830) as per pages 29 to 30 of the Annual Report.
- 5.2 The following were raised by the members to the Executive Committee, and the Chairman/Vice Chairman/ Hon. Treasurer/Committee Members replied as follows:
 - 5.2.1 Raised by Ir. Chong Woei Heng (M22025):

Question: Ir. Chong Woei Heng (M22025) inquired about the depreciation amount, noting a potential typographical error in the presentation.

Answer: Ir. Juraimi Bin Masood (M53830) acknowledged the typographical error in the depreciation amount and stated that it would be amended.



5.2.2 Raised by Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463):

Question: Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463) raised a question regarding the significant balance of "Other Payables and Accruals."

Answer: Ms. Wang Ing Min from T.J. Wang clarified the meaning of "Other Payables

and Accruals." These represent expenses incurred in 2023 but with payments deferred until 2024. As previously noted by the Chairman and Hon. Treasurer, these payments include items such as the secretariat's incentive and other outstanding bills. It was noted that excluding these accruals would result in a

higher reported surplus.

5.3 As there were no other further clarifications and amendments, the meeting unanimously adopted the Financial Reports proposed by Dato' Ir. Steve Chong Yoon On (F03974) and seconded by Ir. Hj. Zainuddin Bin Md Ghazali (F04945).

6.0 Election of Internal and External Auditors

- 6.1 The Chairman thanked the Internal Auditors, Prof. Emeritus Ir. Mohamad Afifi bin Abdul Mukti (M01793) and Ir. Ling Ngie Soon (F12685) for their contributions and services as Internal Auditors for Session 2023/2024. He then proceeded with the nomination process to elect two (2) new internal auditors for session 2024/2025.
- 6.2 Dato' Ir. Steve Chong Yoon On (F03974) proposed that the services of the current auditors Prof. Emeritus Ir. Mohamad Afifi bin Abdul Mukti (M01793) and Ir. Ling Ngie Soon (F12685) be continued and nominated as the Internal Auditors for session Session 2024/2025. This was seconded by Ir. Hj. Zainuddin Bin Md Ghazali (F04945). Both candidates were unanimously accepted by members.
- 6.3 Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock (HF02531) proposed that T.J. Wang continues as IEM (Southern Branch) External Auditor which was seconded by Ir. Sim Tian Liang (M07463). The proposal was unanimously accepted by the members.

7.0 Election Results for Executive Committee for Session 2024/2025

7.1 The election results for the Executive Committee for session 2024/2025 were announced by the Election Officer, Dato' Ir. Steve Chong Yoon On (F03974). The results are listed as follows:

7.1.1 Chairman

The Branch Chairman, Ir. Thayala R Selvaduray (M03717) will be completing his term of office at 51st Annual General Meeting at 9th March 2024. 
